THE PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This document kick starts the process of developing your website so that the website we create reflects how great an organisation you are and enhances your online presence through its quality.

In this document, we'll be covering the first stage of the project which includes the fundamental level of how the website will be structured in terms of the overall content architecture, and how that content architecture feeds into the navigation of the site.

The ideas and concepts in this document are not yet confirmed, so if there are any parts you'd like to change, please let us know and we'll have a look at moving things around for you.



MAKING SENSE OF THE JARGON.

'Archive': A page which works similarly to a blog with posts on it. An individual post can be called a 'Single'. On the frontend of the website, 'Archive' pages can be designed in many ways to suit all sorts of purposes, not just a blog page.

'Single': A page which is like an individual blog post, these pages are for more in-depth content relating to a specific topic.

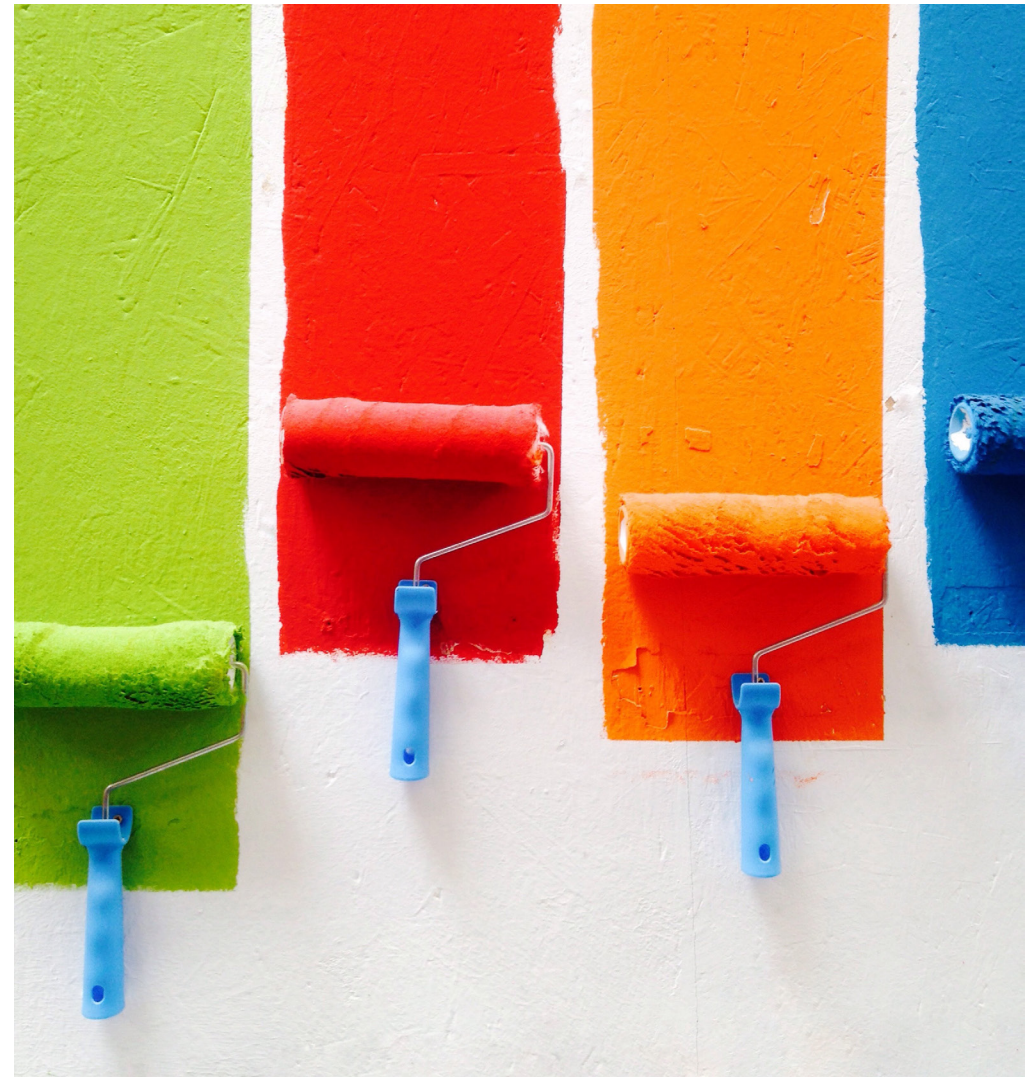
'Custom Post Types': Templates that are used to create 'Single' pages and guide how they will look to the user.

'Custom Fields': Each page is split into several 'Custom Fields', you'll be able to edit the content in each of these from the backend of the website.

'Primary Navigation': The menu which will appear at the top of the website.

'Home Header': This will be the space at the top of the home page. It will hold the content the user first sees when they enter the website. The content will be a background image and some text that will have styling applied to it.

'Internal Header': This will be the space at the top of all pages except the home page. It will be like the 'Home Header' but slimmer and with less content.

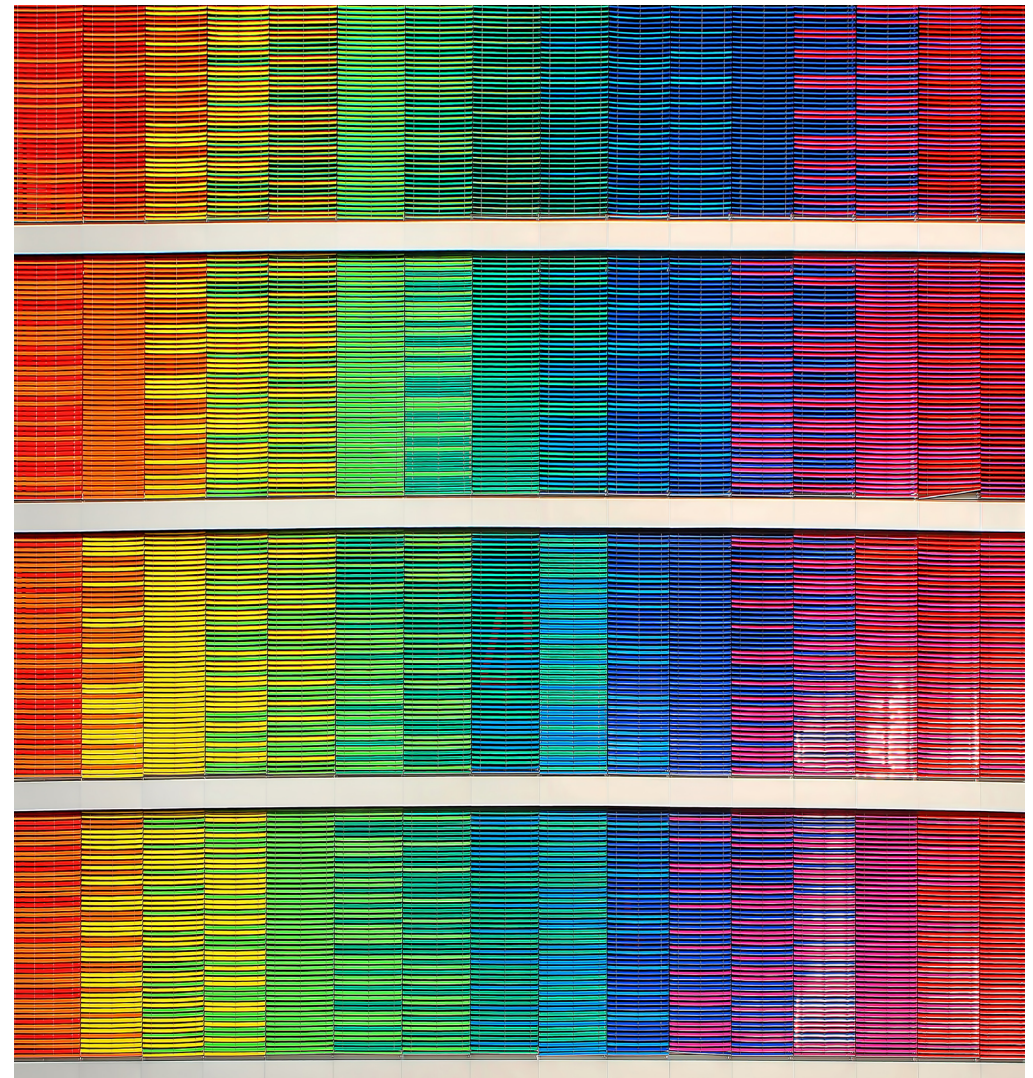


THE STRUCTURAL OVERVIEW.

When looking over the target audiences (schools, young people and youth centres) for this project, the importance of Diversify's objectives should be the first thing they're informed of. This is particularly important given the new regulations coming to schools next year relating to LGBTQ+ matters being taught in schools.

When creating the structure of the website that follows on from the 'Home Header' with the initial important information, the focus was to keep the content clear, open to growth and to highlight the availability of support. The reasons that these factors have been focused on are largely based on the needs of the audience alongside Diversify's activities. When informing teachers and students about a subject, it's good to have a short and sweet version of the subject with the option to delve deeper if needed. The site allows for this whilst also ensuring that it enables for further information to be shared. Here, the structure accommodates for the fact that the groups that Diversify are teaching about require many forms of support, so being able to inform them of other organisations which can offer that support they need can help those communities as a whole. Through its structure, the site is also designed not only support the people going through your training need, but also the support that teachers who haven't gone through the training yet need.

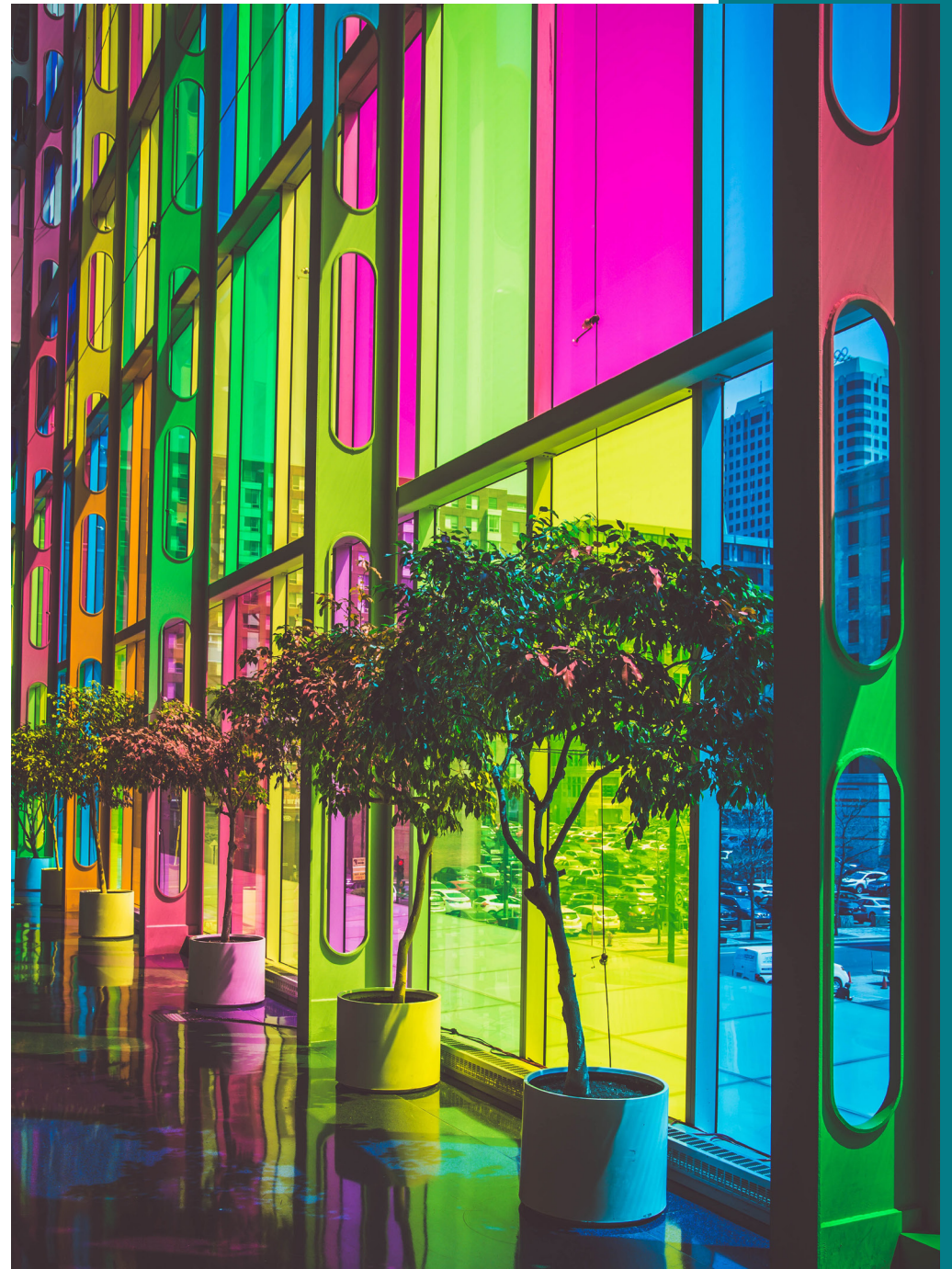
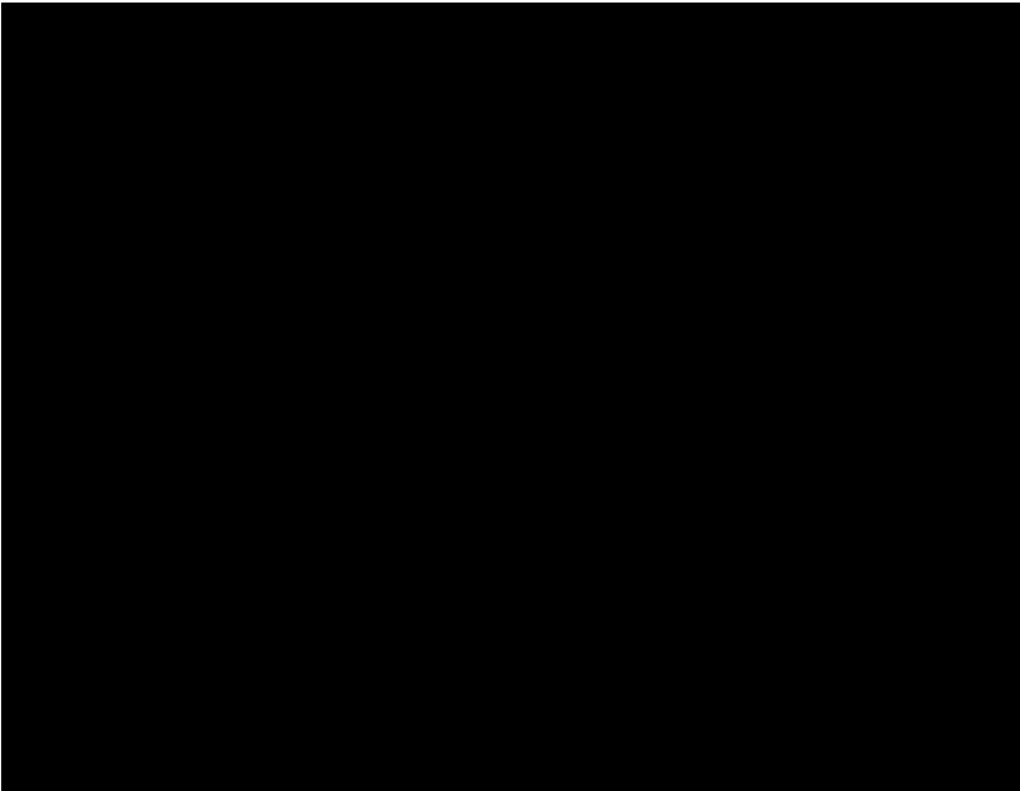

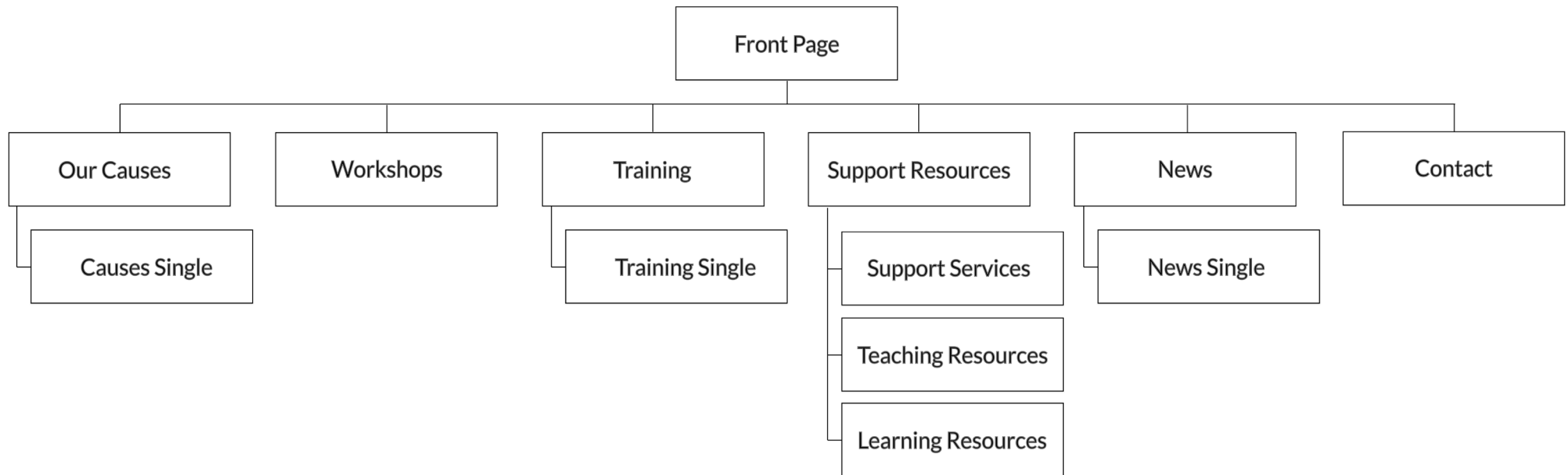
NAVIGATING THROUGH THE WEBSITE.
